



The purpose of this guidance is to support teachers when preparing for and conducting internal assessments.

Many WJEC WJEC Eduqas qualifications include non-examination assessments (NEA) as well as timetabled exams. Non-examination assessments may be internally marked by teachers and externally moderated by WJEC or alternatively they may be marked by WJEC.

Non-examination assessments can include coursework, controlled assessments and portfolios.

Instructions and guidance for teachers on conducting non-examination assessments are available in WJEC specifications and guidance documents as well as JOQ instructions and notices. The following section will guide you to the relevant documents for each type of gualification.

When setting NEA tasks, conducting and marking the assessment, teachers must follow the requirements in the qualification specification and related documentation in addition to the <u>JOQ</u> Instructions for conducting non-examination assessments
